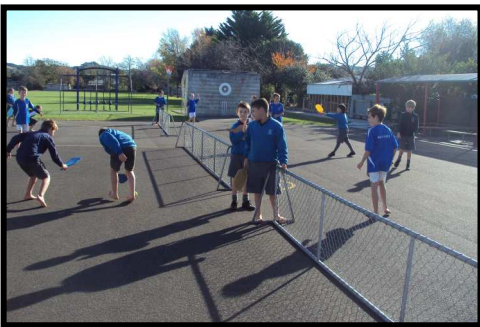
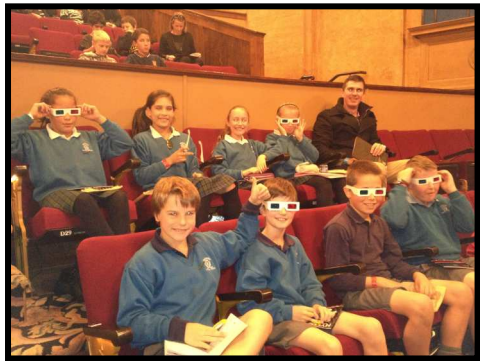
On Tuesday 27th May the House Leaders went to Palmerston North for a National Young Leaders Day, to learn about what it takes to be a good leader.
