MATHS LEARNING

There has been some publicity in the media recently about the Numeracy Project and the lack of impact it has had. It is important to us as a staff that parents understand what happens here at Reignier.

The school Maths model is all about balance. You will have seen the Venn Diagram which is displayed in every classroom. This model shows our programme is made up of a balance of Knowledge – our fast Maths, strategy understanding – finding efficient ways of working out problems and rich open tasks which requires application of both knowledge and strategy to solve problems in real-life context. All of these aspects are equally important and rely on sound teaching and development of each to grow a strong mathematical brain. It can't be just about teaching the basic facts, or learning a multitude of strategies. All these aspects are interlinked.

We have been working for many years with Dinah Harvey who has provided us with extremely effective PD. Alongside her, we have developed and refined our Maths teaching practice, supported by research and in response to our student data.

We still emphasize the need for our learners to have sound knowledge, especially a mastery of basic facts. The introduction of our MLG programme is an example of our response to student data, and which we hope is going to better support the learning of basic facts across the school. The IXL programme is another example.

If you need further support from teachers on how to help at home, don't be afraid to ask. We will be repeating the Bangers and Maths parent evening in Term 3 for those interested. If parents felt they needed it, we could always focus on Basic Facts then.

The partnership between home and school is vitally important in the cementing of these basic facts for learners, and we recognise the hard work put in at home to help children master these. This is fantastic, and we need you to know that this is appreciated by teachers and is such a big help. Keep up the great work.


