CHANGE OF UNIFORM

SAFETY ON THE STREETS

To be reviewed in March

SCHOOL UNIFORM POLICY

Rationale: School uniform is an outward expression of unity, equality and support for Reignier School and its Special Catholic Character.

Purpose:

1. To represent visibly Reignier School within the community
2. To build and maintain a sense of pride amongst the pupils, staff and the school and parish community.

The uniform is as follows:

Girls' Summer Uniform:	summer tunic white short sleeve polo shirt navy stretchies, or appropriate navy underwear black roman sandals or black Clarks Pearl Reignier Catholic School sun hat
Boys' Summer Uniform:	grey shorts blue short sleeve polo shirt black roman sandals, Lynx Cougar or Rugged Sharks Komodo Reignier Catholic School sun hat
Girls' Winter Uniform:	winter tunic white long sleeve polo shirt navy stretchies or appropriate navy underwear navy knee length socks or navy tights black regulation lace up shoes (Velcro or buckle for Yr 0-2) Reignier Catholic School sweatshirt – teal, monogrammed Reignier Catholic School monogrammed sleeveless vest (optional)
Boys' Winter Uniform:	winter grey shorts navy blue long sleeved polo shirt grey ¾ socks black regulation lace up shoes (Velcro or buckle for Yr 0-2) Reignier Catholic School sweatshirt – teal, monogrammed Reignier Catholic School monogrammed sleeveless vest
Sports Uniform	Compulsory for Yr 3 – 6 Compulsory for school sports teams White shorts Reignier Catholic School sports t shirt white ankle socks appropriate shoes

General:

- Hair is to be tidy, clipped back if in the eyes, fully tied up if on the collar and no extreme colours or styles.
- Hair accessories are to be in school colours only.
- No nail polish or body art.
- Jewellery: One plain gold or silver stud earring may be worn in each ear. (boys and girls)
A wrist watch is the only other acceptable jewellery to be worn.
- Any non-uniform items should be preferably removed and placed in school bag, unless explanation is received from parents.
- A school summer hat is compulsory when outdoors in summer months.
- All pupils who bike to and from school are to wear a Cycle Safety Helmet.
- School Newsletters will prepare and remind parents of the seasonal change one month in advance.
Official change over dates are to be: (any variances will appear in the School Newsletter)
Winter Uniform: may be worn from the beginning of Term II, and
must be worn from Queen's Birthday weekend
Summer Uniform: may be worn from the beginning of Term IV, and
must be worn from Labour Weekend
- The school uniform is to be worn at all times when involved in school activities.
- The school uniform should be in good repair and in a clean and tidy condition.
- New parents are to be given a copy of this policy when enrolling their child.
- Parents, on enrolling their child, will be made aware of the requirements of their child to wear the school uniform.
- Any changes to uniform will have a two year transition period.
- The uniform policy will be reviewed in 2016.
