Reignier Catholic School Board of Trustees Update – Term Three 2017

We hope you have had an enjoyable and productive term three, we know it has been a long term in many ways and we hope you all will get a chance to refresh in the coming weeks before the busy term four.

Much of the board focus in the last few months has been on the physical school environment, finalising the school hall project and other related matters. However, alongside that we have been paying particular focus on our student achievement results. At the mid-point of 2017 we are pleased with how our overall student achievement is tracking.

Along with staff the board has also had several strategic planning sessions and discussions as we continue to develop our new school strategic plan in time for 2018. We continue to reflect on the information so many of you provided us with last year via the survey which focused on the school environment (physical and digital), and teaching and communication strategies. We had over 70 responses that as well as providing “ratings” on various aspects of the school, included many additional comments, suggestions and feedback. Indeed, much of that feedback was a catalyst for pushing along (to the extent we could influence) some of the changes to the school grounds in the past two terms. The other information related to teaching and communication strategies (and the use of digital technologies in our teaching) has featured in the first drafts of the strategic plan and we look forward to consulting on this in term four.

School Hall and Grounds

Obviously much of the focus of term two and three was on the completion of our new school hall and the removal of other classrooms, the demolition of the old hall and the “tidying up” of some of the spaces left behind. We are delighted with the new hall and how the school is currently looking, including the new playground! As many people commented at the school hall opening, so much of what we are grateful for at our school is down to the hard work of others that have gone through the school before us. That said we are also very grateful to our current school community, and particularly our hardworking PTA, for what you are contributing to our school both for current and future students.

We wish you and all the children and staff a relaxing term break and look forward to seeing you again in term four.
