We had a near miss this morning when a student from Tamatea High School was nearly knocked off his bicycle. Thank you to the parents who came to his aid and sorted him out. Should incidents' like this occur, our best practice is to bring the injured student(s) or person(s) concerned (only if movable) into the school and let school personnel make contact with the necessary person(s). Please don't make arrangements to move or transport the person yourself. If you have any questions or concerns around this please don't hesitate to come in and see me.

Fr Barry visited our school last Friday and joined the staff for prayers. It was great to meet Fr Barry and welcome him to our community. Fr Barry is going away on a sabbatical until mid September and we wish him a safe journey and eagerly await his return. In my interview, the question was asked, How do I see Reignier Catholic School in a few years? This was my reply and this something I want the Reignier community to ponder. I want Reignier to be a **"Beacon of Hope and a Pillar of Strength"** in our community. Therefore not only am I the school manager but I am also the faith leader of our school. My invitation to all parents is please feel free to join in ALL activities at Reignier school but to participate in all things Catholic as well.

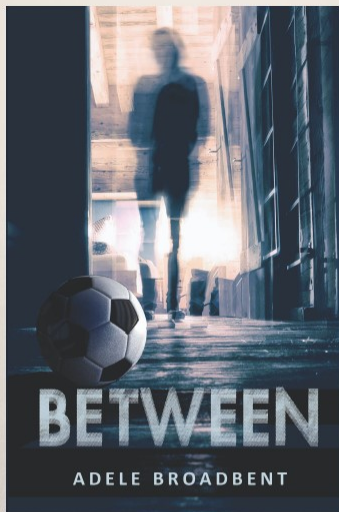
